His newest single "This Ole Boy," currently climbing the country radio charts, is the title track to his sixth studio CD, out now on Black River Entertainment. The new album boasted a Top 5 debut on Billboard's Top Country Albums chart when it released on February 28, 2012. Craig received one of country music's highest honors when he was inducted as a member of the Grand Ole Opry in 2008. Prior to becoming a country music and TV sensation, Craig Morgan spent over 10 years of active duty in the Army and an additional nine

years in the Army Reserves. He is an avid supporter of America's military personnel and a recipient of the 2006 USO Merit Award.
